## Halloween Safety Tips for Your Cat

1. Especially for black cats, Halloween is a dangerous time. However, any cat is at risk outdoors after dark on Halloween. Make sure your cat is confined indoors and away from any entryways when Trick-or-Treaters pay you a visit!
2. Keep candy and candy wrappers away and out of reach. Many Halloween treats, like chocolate, are toxic to both cats and dogs. Candy wrappers can become toys that turn into intestinal blockages for playful cats.
3. Be mindful of Halloween decorations (wires, electric cords) and lit candles (in a Jack-o-Lantern.) Curious cats might try to play with these!
4. Do not force your cat to wear a Halloween costume. Many cats find wearing clothing to be stressful.
